

Jerry Darnell, S.A.L Southern Maryland Regional Commander, led a contingent of swimmers into the cold waters of Chesapeake Bay; part of the thousands who participated in the Maryland State Police's Polar Bear Plunge fundraiser for the Special Olympics. Darnell said temperatures were in the 30's and had an even colder wind chill. "Many of us were hesitant, but we plunged into the cold water anyway motivated by the event's purpose of raising money for the Maryland Special Olympics. Between gasps of breath acknowledging how cold they were, some swimmers declared the fundraising purpose kept them going." The ongoing tally of accumulated funds helped cold-plungers' excitement and gratitude for generous donations." Darnell said the Sons of the American Legion detachment of Maryland donated \$15,000 and the Auxiliary Unit 136 and Sons of the American Legion Squadron 136 donated \$5,000 each toward the more than \$3 million raised. "S.A.L. Squadron 136 and Auxiliary Unit 136 proudly support the Special Olympics," said Darnell. "The Special Olympics Maryland works to provide sports opportunities for athletes, no matter their ability level."

#### AMERICAN LEGION POST 136 FAMILY SUPPORTS MARYLAND NATIONAL GUARD INAUGURAL TROOPS

American Legion Auxiliary Unit 136 and Sons of the American Legion Squadron 136 combined efforts aiding Maryland National Guard troops supporting the 60<sup>th</sup> presidential inauguration. Auxiliary Unit 136 President, Kathy Gigliotti, said the Auxiliary Unit used its association with the Maryland Army National Guard to determine how American Legion Post 136 could support the Guard Unit's presidential inaugural parade activities. "The Guard rep shared that their unit of approximately 800 troops would be helping with the inaugural parade," said Gigliotti. "She let us know that any way we could help would be appreciated. The troops would be exposed to cold for an extended time. We decided various snacks such as power bars and other goodies would help. Because the troops were exposed to the cold, we included 300 pairs of hand warmers. All of our shopping efforts online and at discount centers were assembled and delivered to the Guard Unit at the Naval Warfare Center."

S.A.L. used its monetary contribution to purchase hundreds of snacks and power bars. "It was an opportunity to join the Auxiliary Unit in both community and military support by assisting the National Guard," said Jerry Darnell, S.A.L. Southern Maryland Regional Commander.
